

Bingo

What should be included:

- Book – Bingo
- Foam Puzzle
- Who's Feeling What Game
- Bluey Family Figures (Dad, Mom, Bluey & Bingo)
- Bluey's House
- Furniture

Book and Activity:

Read – Bingo:

The book, Bingo, finds Bluey going for a playdate at Chloe's, which leaves Bingo home without anyone to play with. The only games Bingo could think of to play needed more than one person but Dad has the great idea to give Bingo a problem to solve.

Activity:

“Missing Puzzle Piece”

After reading the book, let your child pretend to be Bingo with a problem to solve. Explain that you would like him/her to work this puzzle and then tell you what mom is doing to Bluey.

- **Before you give your child the puzzle**, take out the biggest piece (it is in a bag of its own) and go hide it.
- Now give your child the rest of the puzzle pieces
- Help him/her to work the puzzle and then ask again “What is Mom doing to Bluey?”
- When your child notices that the puzzle piece that can answer the question is missing, have him/her go find it, finish the puzzle and answer the question.

Social Emotional Activity:

“Emoji Emotions”

In this game, you will need the 6 emoji cards and the emotion identification photographs.

- To begin, show your child one emoji card at a time and talk about what emotion it is showing – photos for emoji identification is included (the name of the emotion is on the back of each photo).
- Ask your child to share a time he/she felt that emotion or what could cause him/her to feel that emotion.

“Who’s Feeling What?”

In this game, you will need the 6 emoji cards and the 12 picture cards of friends placed in the video board of which are showing the 6 emotions that match the emoji cards.

- Once again show your child one emoji card at a time and help him/her remember what emotion it is showing (review emoji photos if needed)
- Then ask your child if he/she can find 2 friends on the game board that are showing the same emotion as the emoji you are showing him/her
- When your child has located the 2 friends that match the emoji, remove the 2 friends and lay them over to the side with the matching emoji
- When all friends have been removed from the board, then use the green cards to ask a question (there is a question on both sides)
- Have your child locate the 2 friends that answer the question and place them back into the game board
- Continue this play until all friends have been placed back into the board

Bluey Fun:

Now it is you and your child’s turn to think of things for Bluey and Bingo to play !

- First just let your child just explore Bluey’s house and accessories
- Next think of some of your favorite episodes of Bluey and see if you can pretend to play what Bluey and Bingo were doing in each of them

- Below are listed some of Bluey and Bingo's favorite games:
 - Keepy Uppy
 - Grannies
 - Magic Asparagus
 - Featherwand
 - Hide-and-Seek
- Now that you and your child have played some of their favorite games, it's time to teach them some of your favorite games
- Next try to make up a **NEW GAME** for Bluey and Bingo
